Want to try out college before leaving high school? Consider signing up for concurrent enrollment. If you are in 11th or 12th grade and have made good grades throughout school or scored well on the ACT or SAT, you might consider taking credit-earning college courses while still in high school. You can enroll in college courses if you meet one of the admission requirements listed on the provided tables and other conditions listed below.

High school seniors who meet the eligibility requirements are entitled to receive tuition waivers for up to 18 credit hours and high school juniors can receive tuition waivers up to 9 credit hours, subject to available funding.



#### **1. The Basics**

Higher education is an investment in your future, and there are many options to help you pay for that investment. The first step is to understand these options and make the best decisions based on your family's situation. #### 2. Apply for Financial Aid

You won't get any aid without taking the first step: you must APPLY!

You are not obligated to accept any financial aid you are offered, so there's no harm in applying.

#### 3. Know Your Responsibilities

Financial aid comes with responsibilities that continue throughout your college career. To continue receiving aid, you'll need to keep working toward your degree and submit a FAFSA each year. 
#### How do I apply for financial aid?

You should complete the **Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) I**<sup>2</sup> as soon as it becomes available in your senior year of high school and each year you are in college. By completing this application, you have applied for most federal and state financial aid.



To complete the FAFSA you will need an **FSA ID (Federal Student Aid) G**, a username and password that allows you to log in to some Department of Education websites as well as access and electronically sign your FAFSA. The first time you submit the FAFSA, you'll need to create your FSA ID and allow 2-3 days for the login credentials to be verified. After your FSA ID is approved, you'll be able to submit your FAFSA.





#### Making College More Affordable

The funds you receive from federal and state aid may not be enough to cover your total expense of going to college. Here are more options to help you pay the way to college.



#### **Military Veterans and their Dependents**

Educational benefits and scholarships are available to those who serve in the U.S. Armed Forces. In some programs, enlistees receive an education first, and serve an equivalent amount of military time after graduation. Other programs allow you to accumulate money for an education while completing an initial enlistment period. Some scholarships pay full tuition and all instructional fees, and may include a living allowance. Loan repayment is also available to Army service personnel. For more information, contact your local Armed Forces recruiting office.

# **K-12 & Higher Education Partnerships**

#### **Connect with school district**

- ICAP leader
- Participate in ICAP team
- Help resolve barriers to ICAP efforts

#### **Build mutually beneficial relationships**

- High school can help meaningfully recruit students
- College can connect professionals in specific career fields as guest speakers
- Provide access to postsecondary information required for ICAP
- Relationships should go beyond your recruitment team

# **K-12 & Higher Education Partnerships**

#### **Common Barriers**

- Creating partnerships with postsecondary institutions
- Coordinating opportunities to have professionals visit their campus
- Venues for large student-centered events

#### Partner & Support

- Reach out to individual schools for potential recruiting efforts
- Develop partnerships with your alumni network
- Offer discounted (or free) space to host high school events in return for the opportunity to promote your institution

#### Jump Start Conversations

- ICAP is a jumping-off point to begin the conversation about students' longterm goals.
- Oklahoma students are now coming to college more ready than ever to have conversations about where they see themselves after graduation.

#### Recruitment

- Using OKcollegestart to connect users directly to their institutions of interest
- Intentional campus visits: both campus tours and high school visits

#### **Career Guidance Centers**

- Start working with students the day they arrive on your campus to work towards their goals
- Intentionally plan internships
- Students are already coming in with experience

#### **Retention & Completion Initiatives**

- Connect students directly to the resources they need early
- Connect students directly to social organizations and communities prior to first semester, etc.
