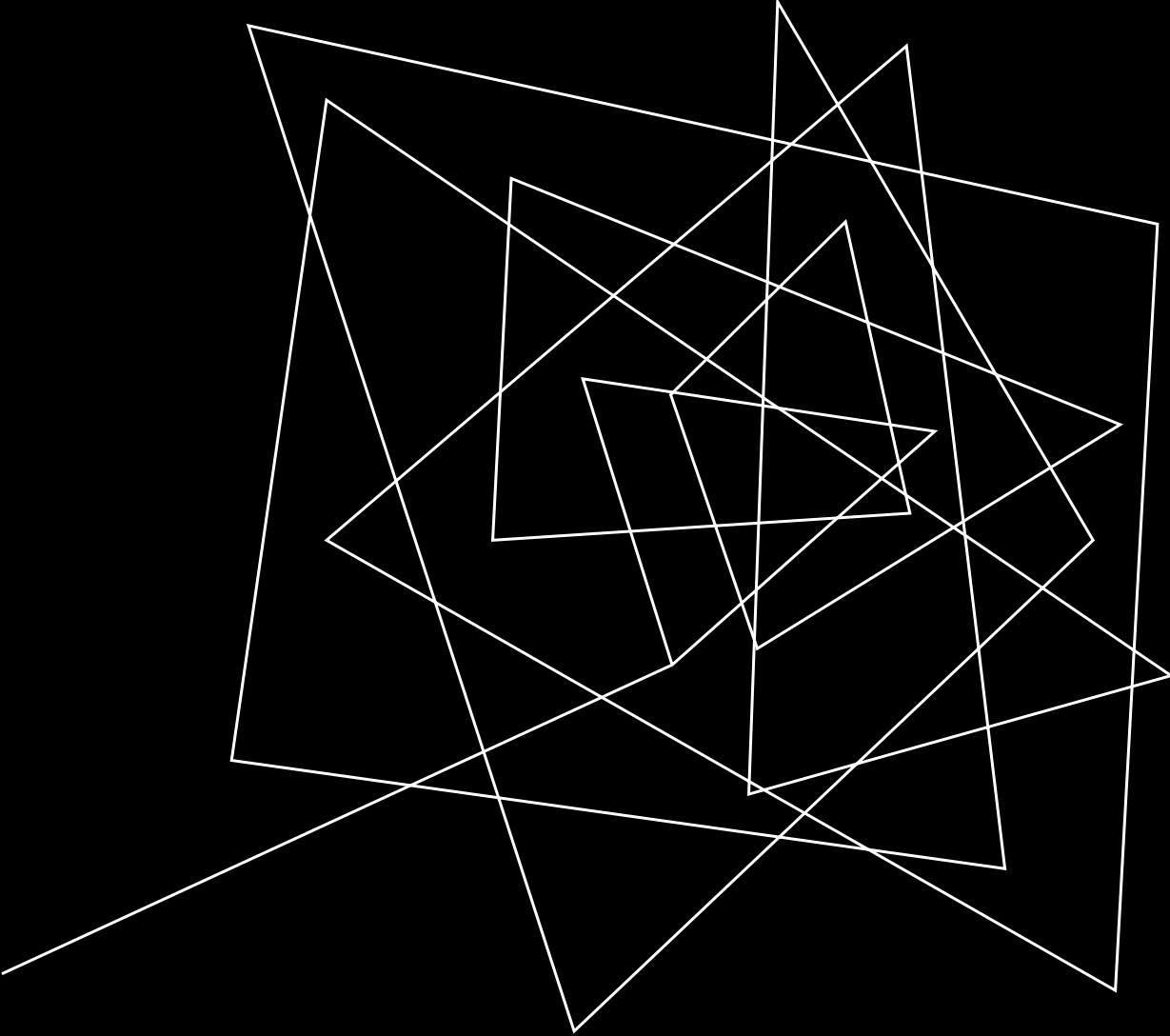

RECENT CHANGES
TO OSRHE POLICY



3.10 CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT

- Early College Programs section
 - Corrected some language about a “high school degree.”
 - Added information about assessing ECHS programs.
 - Added procedures for approval, denial, and revocation of ECHS programs.

3.18 IN-STATE/OUT-OF-STATE STATUS OF ENROLLED STUDENTS

- Added recipients of Chapter 35 VA Education Benefits to the list of those entitled to in-state status.
 - Confusing language regarding this will be fixed at the December State Regents meeting!
- Added members of the uniformed service who were stationed in Oklahoma for at least one year in the previous ten years, along with the member's spouse and/or dependents to in-state status.
- Adds members of the Oklahoma National Guard to in-state status.
- Increased the length of time (from 5 years to 10 years) that service members who are discharged or released from active service after a period of at least 90 days are entitled to in-state status. Also applies to spouses and/or dependents.
 - This only applies to students who are not classified as in-state by virtue of another section (i.e. receiving VA Education Benefits, etc.)

3.4 ACADEMIC PROGRAM APPROVAL

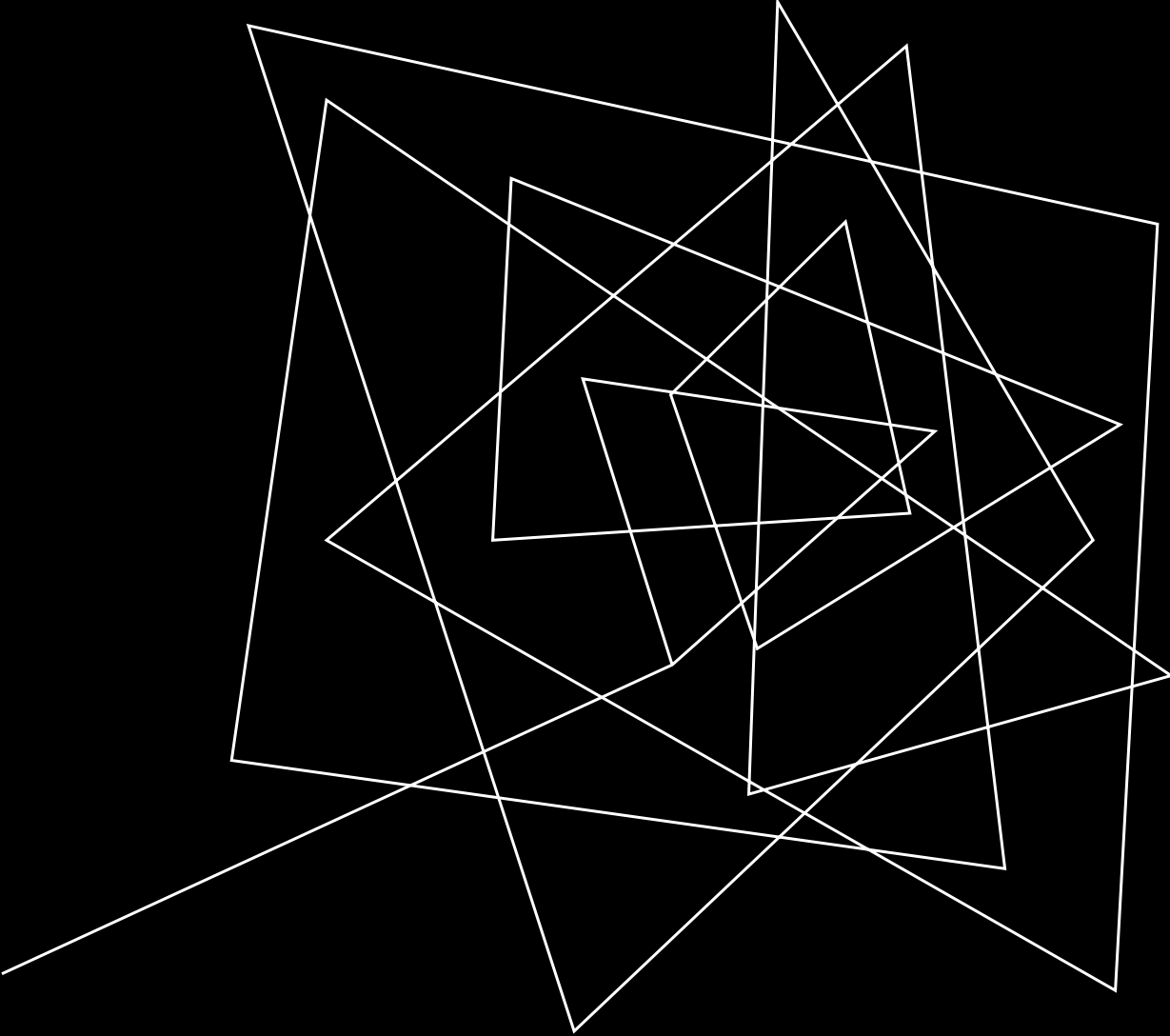
- Removed letter of intent requirement for certificates of less than 15 credit hours.
- Placed certificates on a 5-year program review cycle.



OSRHE POLICY FLEXIBILITY

- The (most likely) final extension was approved in April.
- Only applies to these areas:
 - Teacher Education requirements
 - English proficiency testing
 - Online labs

GENERAL EDUCATION

These potential revisions are still very much in the early stages and will most likely change before they are finalized. They would affect the **Undergraduate Transfer and Articulation (3.11)** and **Undergraduate Degree Requirements (3.15)** policies.



GENERAL EDUCATION

The vision for this work has been to streamline transfer, reduce lost credit hours, and to help the general education requirements make sense from a State System perspective.

This is up for approval at the December meeting. It's a very routine update about how grants are handled internally.

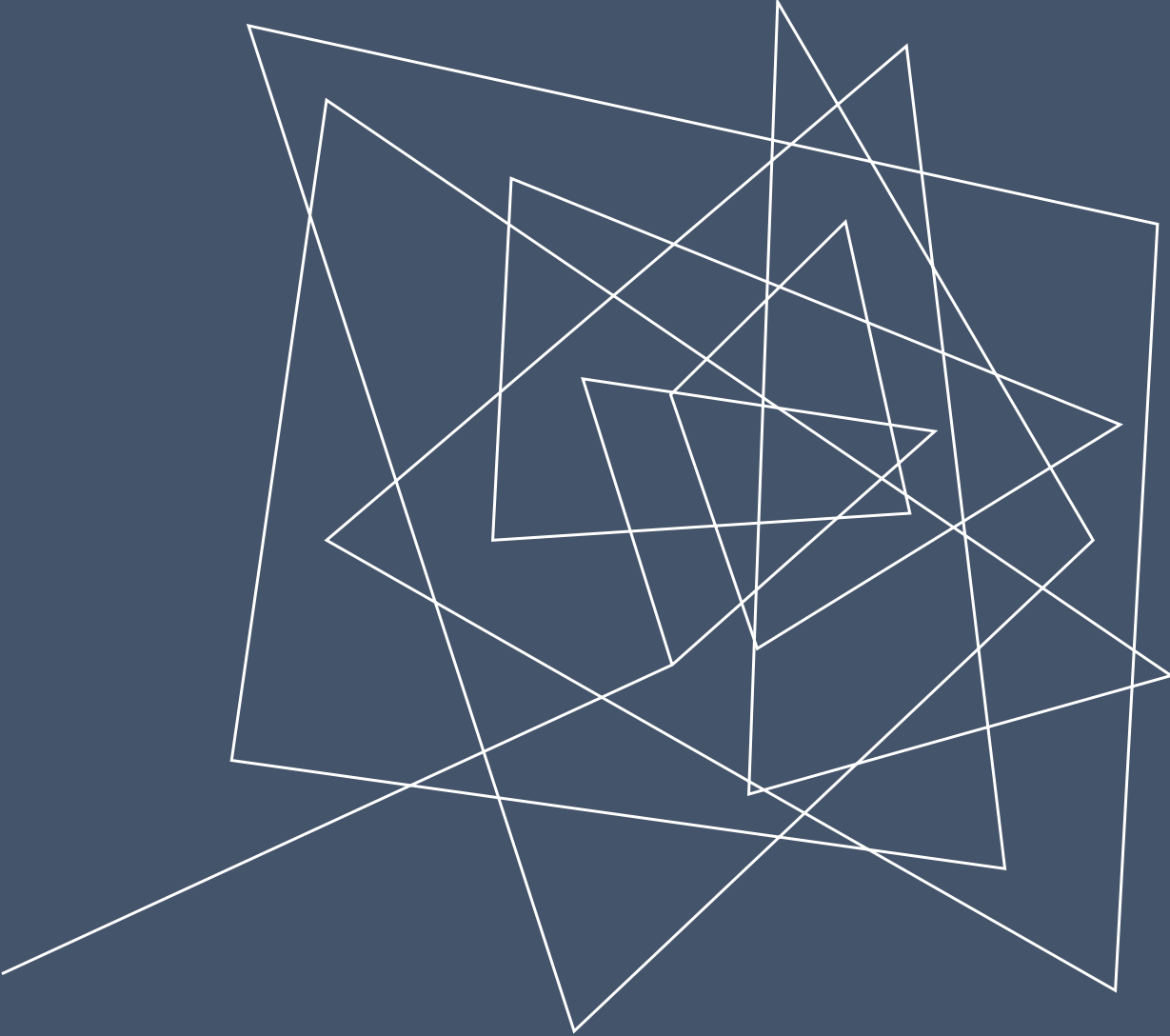
